




## Large Trees Over 30 feet tall

**KEY:**

- Provides food for butterflies
- Provides food & nesting for hummingbirds
- Provides food, cover, or nesting for birds

### Anacua *Ehretia anacua*



- Evergreen tree 50 ft x 45 ft
- Sun/part sun
- Low water
- Spring bloom, fall fruit
- Fast growing
- Sandy & clay loams in S TX



### American Elm *Ulmus americana*

- Deciduous tree 55 ft x 45 ft
- Full sun/part sun
- Low water
- Fast-growing
- E half of TX



### Cedar Elm *Ulmus crassifolia*

- Deciduous tree 60 ft x 30 ft
- Sun/Low water
- Fall blooms
- Along streams in C & S TX

### Bald Cypress *Taxodium distichum*


- Conifer 50 ft x 30 ft
- Bald Cypress is deciduous
- Montezuma cypress is semi-evergreen (*T. mucronatum*)
- Sun
- High water 1st year to establish, then low water
- Native to E half of TX




### Mesquite *Prosopis glandulosa*

- Spiny deciduous tree 35 ft x 35 ft
- Sun
- Very low water
- Spring bloom
- Very salt tolerant
- Native to TX

	<h3>Lacey Oak</h3> <p><i>Quercus laceyi</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Deciduous tree 30 ft x 30 ft</li> <li>Sun/part shade</li> <li>Low water</li> <li>Native in TX</li> <li>Texas Superstar</li> </ul>  		<h3>Live Oak</h3> <p><i>Quercus virginiana</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Spreading evergreen tree 50 ft x 80 ft</li> <li>Sun</li> <li>Low water</li> <li>Salt tolerant</li> <li>Various soils on coast, E &amp; S TX</li> </ul>

<h3>Sugarberry Hackberry</h3> <p><i>Celtis laevigata</i></p>  	 <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Deciduous tree 50 ft x 40 ft</li> <li>Sun/part sun</li> <li>Low water</li> <li>Salt tolerant</li> <li>Along streams in woodlands in E two-thirds of TX</li> </ul>	<h3>Texas Ebony</h3> <p><i>Ebenopsis ebano</i></p> 	   <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Evergreen spiny tree 30 ft x 30 ft</li> <li>Sun/part sun</li> <li>Low water</li> <li>Salt tolerant</li> <li>Sandy to clay loams in S TX</li> </ul>

 <p><b>Small Trees</b> Up to 30 feet tall</p> <p>KEY:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>🦋 Provides food for butterflies</li> <li>🐦 Provides food &amp; nesting for hummingbirds</li> <li>🐦 Provides food, cover, or nesting for birds</li> </ul>	<p><b>Bottlebrush</b> <i>Callistemon rigidus</i></p> 	 <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Evergreen tree 20 ft x 10 ft</li> <li>• Sun</li> <li>• Low to high water</li> <li>• Blooms spring-summer</li> <li>• Salt tolerant</li> <li>• Hardy to low 20°</li> <li>• Native to Australia</li> </ul>

<p><b>Crape Myrtle</b> <i>Lagerstroemia indica</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Deciduous tree</li> <li>• Sun/partial shade</li> <li>• Medium water</li> <li>• Blooms summer-fall</li> <li>• Best varieties: Natchez White 30 ft x 10 ft resistant to aphids, mildew Basham Party Pink 20 ft x 10 ft slightly resistant to aphids, mildew</li> <li>• Native to Asia</li> </ul> 	<p><b>Desert Willow</b> <i>Chilopsis linearis</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Deciduous tree 30 ft x 30 ft</li> <li>• Full sun</li> <li>• Very low water</li> <li>• Blooms spring-fall</li> <li>• Deer resistant</li> <li>• Native to C &amp; W TX</li> </ul>

<p><b>Farkleberry</b> <i>Vaccinium arboreum</i></p>  	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Evergreen or deciduous tree 10 ft x 10 ft</li> <li>• Part sun/shade</li> <li>• Very low water</li> <li>• Spring blooms</li> <li>• Fall fruit</li> <li>• Understory plant</li> <li>• Native on deep coastal sands in SE TX</li> </ul> 	 <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Evergreen tree 25 ft x 15 ft</li> <li>• Sun/part sun</li> <li>• Low to medium water</li> <li>• Blooms spring-fall</li> <li>• Hardy to 20°</li> <li>• Seeds are toxic</li> <li>• S TX native</li> </ul>	<p><b>Mexican Poinciana</b> <i>Caesalpinia mexicana</i></p>

**Texas Redbud**  
*Cercis canadensis*  
var. *texensis*

- Deciduous tree  
20 ft x 15 ft
- Full sun/part sun
- Low water
- Mexican Redbud *var. mexicana* - lower water
- Blooms spring
- Native in W, C & N TX



**Red Bay**  
*Persea borbonia*

- Evergreen tree 30 ft x 30 ft
- Sun/shade
- Low water
- Fall fruit
- Understory plant
- Salt tolerant
- In woods, swamps, along streams in SE TX



**Texas Kidneywood**  
*Eysenhardtia texana*



**Wild Olive**  
*Cordia boissieri*

- Evergreen tree  
20 ft x 15 ft
- Sun
- Low water
- Blooms spring-fall
- Salt tolerant
- Hardy to 20°
- Various soils in S TX



**Texas Mountain Laurel**  
*Sophora secundiflora*

- Evergreen slow-growing tree  
20 ft x 12 ft
- Sun/part sun
- Low water
- Spring blooms
- Salt tolerant



- Deer resistant
- Limestone soils on coast, C & SW TX



**Yaupon Holly**  
*Ilex vomitoria*



- Evergreen tree  
20 ft x 15 ft
- Full sun/part sun/shade
- Low to high water
- Spring bloom
- Fall fruit
- Understory
- Salt tolerant
- Native to Texas
